Once the books and manuscripts have been awarded, no complaints will be accepted relating to: damage to the binding, stains, bookworm holes, trimmed papers or plates and any other defect that does not compromise the completeness and integrity of the text; nor the lack of indexes of tables, eyelets, white sheets, advertising inserts, supplements and appendices subsequent to the publication of the work.
